<u>Failure/Re-take Policy:</u> Grades are reflective of student mastery of content. If a student earns a failing grade (70 or below) on any test or quiz, they are allowed the opportunity to re-take the assessment and prove mastery. The re-take must be taken within one week of the posting of the grade to Skyward. Students who DID earn a 70 or higher and would like to retake the assessment to receive a higher score may do so only ONCE per 9-weeks. Some practice work may need to be completed prior to re-assessment.

NOTE Re-assessment will be in a different format than original test (essay).

<u>Course Description:</u> The World History course attempts to create a greater understanding of the historical development of global processes and contacts between different types of human societies. The course will cover events from approximately 8000 BCE to the present, including early modern, modern, and contemporary periods.

Throughout the year, traditional historical points of reference in world history are identified as students analyze important global events and issues, including civilizations in Southwest, East, and South Asia, Africa, and the Americas. Students evaluate traditions and institutions, which form the basis of the world's major civilizations and cultures. Students examine the impact of geographic factors on major historic events and identify the historic origins of contemporary economic items. Students analyze the process by which democratic-republican governments evolved as well as the ideas from historic documents that influenced that process. Students trace the historical development of important legal and political concepts. Students examine the history and impact of major religious and philosophical traditions. Students analyze the connections between major developments in science and technology and the growth of economies, and they use the process
